

How to Sew a Sampler Quilt: 49 Other Pioneer Projects for the Modern Girl

- Fabric scraps in a variety of colors and patterns
 - Scissors
 - Rotary cutter and cutting mat (optional)
 - Sewing machine
 - Thread
 - Iron and ironing board
1. **Choose your fabrics.** The first step is to choose the fabrics that you will use for your sampler quilt. You can use any type of fabric, but it is important to choose fabrics that are similar in weight and texture. You will also want to consider the colors and patterns of the fabrics, as you will want them to create a pleasing overall effect.
