
Ron Paul: A Legacy of Principle and Passion

Early Life and Career

Ron Paul was born on August 20, 1935, in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He graduated from Gettysburg College in 1957 and from Duke University School of Medicine in 1961. 

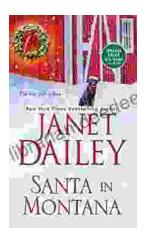
