



Bramall is a member of the House of Lords and is a frequent commentator on military and international affairs.

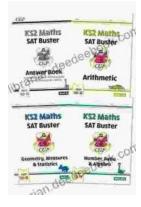

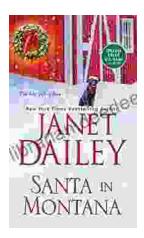
